Charity drives at Stonegate. This is not a year for cutting back on help to the less fortunate. So, as last year, we'll run two:

- **Chrysalis Domestic Violence Shelters.** Realtor Karen Weston introduced us to this group a couple of years ago. She has been very involved with them for many years. They need new goodies and gift cards for some of the 1200 abused women

- **Vista del Camino Food Bank.** They are already serving twice as many needy families as last year. This program is run by Scottsdale’s Human Services Department, so you know that your contributions of non-perishable foods will benefit people closest to home. They are especially hoping to get canned, boxed and bagged food (ravioli, mac and cheese, bagged pasta, rice, beans), peanut butter, cereal, instant potatoes, and canned or other no-refrigeration meats. They also hope to receive turkey gift certificates since they have no freezer space to hold frozen turkeys.
