**Let's talk cameras!** Last year we added two powerful, high-tech cameras which watch the pool area 24/7. The gate house has a big multi-image monitor and the gate staff can see what's going on at the pool, even after dark. A very large DVR records everything, time-stamped and zoom-able for closer inspection. If needed, the videos can be accessed weeks later and written to a DVD. Fines have been issued for inappropriate behavior, based on the information these cameras provide. They've been an important tool in maintaining a pleasant recreational amenity for you and your family to enjoy.

**Let's talk gates!** At last night's meeting, the Board approved purchase of the same type of cameras for Retreat, Regal and East gates. They will be tied into the existing system -- a new tool to monitor entries into the community and, if necessary, help us enforce the rules. Gate officers will be able to see what's happening at all gates, day and night. New signage installed last year makes it very clear to vendors that the main gate is their only entrance into the community. The cameras are an important tool which will allow us to identify vendors who do not comply. When residents call with reports of improper access, we will be able to find video of the offending vehicle -- caught in the act.

Even with the cameras, this is not a secured community, nor could it become one. The biggest contributor to community safety is still the cooperation and common sense of the people who live here.
